### Admission Procedure for incoming first-time college students:

- 1. Take the COMET and be placed into a program at the college. A test fee of \$5 will be collected. The COMET is administered in November at the State campuses for spring admission, and in February to March at all the high schools and the State campuses.
- 2. Obtain an <u>Application for Admission form</u> from a high school counselor, State Campus Dean, or at the College's website.
- 3. Complete the Application for Admission, and mail it with the \$10 admission fee to: Office of Admissions, Records and Retention

4. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the FAFSA renewal, and either submit it to the COM-FSM Financial Aid Office or mail it directly to:

5. Request that official high school transcript or General Educational Development (GED) scores are sent to the Office of Admissions, Records and Retention (OARR). High school seniors should submit a seven-semester transcript.

### Admission Procedure for college transfer students

- 1) Obtain an <u>Application for Admission form</u> from a high school counselor, State Campus Dean, or at the College's website.

3) Complete the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA) or the FAFSA renewal, and either submit it to the COM-FSM Financial Aid Office or mail it directly to:
