The essays are corrected by a team of college faculty and staff members who are trained to read and score the essay based on a scoring rubric. The rubric has five categories (syntax, vocabulary, organization, coherence, and content) worth 0-5 points for each category for a possible overall total of 25 points. Every essay is read and scored separately by two essay readers. The scores from the two readers are then added together for the final essay score. The final combined essay scores range from 0-50 points.

#### C. Other Entrance Criteria

A student who scored  $\geq 500$  in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL<sup>®</sup>), *paper-based test*, is placed on degree- and college-level courses. However, the college may accept equivalent scores from other standardized English language proficiency tests for entrance and placement purposes.

Appendix "A" of this policy provides a table of equivalency of the TOEFL® *paper-based test* scores to TOEFL®'s *computer-based test* (CBT) and *internet based test* (iBT), including Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC®), International English Language Testing System (ILETS<sup>TM</sup>), Cambridge Exam, Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), and Vocation English Certificate (VEC) level system.
