Dear President Daisy:

The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges, at its meeting June 4-6, 2014, reviewed the Follow-Up Report and Supplemental Report submitted by College of Micronesia-FSM. Both Reports were certified by the College leadership, including the chair of the Board of Regents.

Based on the Reports and evidence presented by the College, the Commission finds that the institution has completely addressed Recommendation 6, resolved the deficiencies, and meets Accreditation Standard III.B.2.a. The Commission expects that the government of the Federated States of Micronesia will guarantee the funding necessary for the College to carry out its mission.

The Follow-Up and Supplemental Reports submitted in March and April 2014 will become part of the accreditation history of the College. The Commission requires that you give the Follow-Up Report, the Supplemental Report, and this letter appropriate dissemination to your College staff and to those who were signatories of the Reports. This group should include the Board of Regents, and campus leadership.

The Commission also requires that the Reports and this Commission action letter be made available to students and the public by placing a copy on the College website. Please note that in response to public interest in disclosure, the Commission now requires institutions to post accreditation information on a page no farther than one click from the institution's home page.

Institutions are expected to meet Eligibility Requirements, Accreditation Standards, and Commission policies at all times during the six-year review cycle. It is expected that the changes and improvements noted in the Follow-Up Report will continue to be sustained. This will be verified at the time of the next regularly scheduled visit. The College will submit its next Institutional Self Evaluation of Educational Quality and Institutional Effectiveness Report in preparation for the comprehensive review in **March 2016**. Please note that the comprehensive evaluations will be based upon the Accreditation Standards adopted in June 2014.
