


The college has a spring 2023 enrollment of 1,611 students with 18,804 registered credits (or 1,567 full-time equivalent students).

# **FINANCIAL AID: COLLEGE AWARDS \$3.210 MILLION PELL** GRANT TO 1,040 STUDENTS ENROLLED THIS SPRING 2023

371 STUDENTS RECEIVED \$46.556.50 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE SEG WORK-STUDY PROGRAM

The college's Financial Aid Office (FAO) reported that as of March 20, 2023, it awarded \$3,210,125.00 Pell Grant to 1,040 students enrolled this spring 2023.

According to the acting director of FAO, "The 990 students represent 79% of the Pelleligible students enrolled this spring 2023 semester. FAO targets to award all Pelleligible students enrolled this spring 2023 by the end of April 2023."



The college's registrar also reported that National and Yap Campuses surpassed their spring 2023 enrollment targets in both headcounts and registered credits. National Campus exceeded its spring 2023 enrollment

targets in headcounts and registered credits by 10.37% and 8.38%, respectively; while Yap Campus exceeded its spring enrollment target in headcounts by 20.13%, and in registered credits by 3.83%.

#### SEG AND SEG WORK-STUDY PROGRAM

111 SEG-eligible students enrolled last fall 2022 received \$110,684.90 financial assistance from the Supplemental Education Grant (SEG); while 344 students who had enrolled in the SEG Work-Study Program last fall 2022 received \$126,628.25 financial assistance from the program.

FAO further reported that as of March 20, 2023, that 371 students had enrolled in the SEG Work-Study Program this spring 2023 semester, and they were awarded \$46,556.50 financial assistance from the program.

# FSM NATIONAL & STATE SCHOLARSHIPS, **INCLUDING CFSM SUBSIDY**

Last fall 2022, 130 students received \$111,750.00 financial assistance from the FSM National and State Scholarships.

As of March 20, 2023, 79 students enrolled this spring 2023 received \$78,220.00 financial assistance from the FSM National Scholarship and subsidy from the Congress of the FSM (CFSM).

# WE CARE STUDENT AID & LAPTOP STUDENT **CARE FOR SPRING 2023**

248 students enrolled this spring 2023 received \$378,003.10 financial aid from the college's We Care Student Aid under the US Coronavirus (COVID-19) emergency grants for postsecondary education: Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF II & III).

The college provides support to students facing financial hardships due to the COVID-19 Pandemic through supplemental financial assistance from HEERF-Institutional Portion to cover their outstanding (or unpaid) tuition and matriculation fees, including on-campus room and board fees after all federal grants and national and state scholarships are applied.

60 students also received free laptops from the COM-FSM Laptop Student Care. Funded under the college's HEERF-Institutional Portion, the college provides free laptops to eligible students so they're able to participate in the learning process while attending the college.

77% OF THE 938 SENIORS ARE PLACED INTO THE COLLEGE'S DEGREE. ACE AND CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS; 23% NON-ADMIT

The college administered the COM-FSM Entrance Test (COMET) for summer and fall 2023 admission to high school seniors and other students last January 31, to February 28, 2023.

According to he college's registrar, "A total of 1,243 students took the COMET with only seniors from the three high schools (Moch, Mortlocks,

and Weipat) in Chuuk State left to take the college's entrance test. Two high schools in Yap: Neighboring Island Community High School (NICHS) and Yap Seventh Day Adventist School are temporarily affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. NICHS is currently closed, and Yap SDA School has only two seniors."









Of the 938 seniors, 369 (or 39%) are placed into degree programs; 144 (or 15%) into Achieving College's Excellence (ACE); and 213 (or 23%) into

certificate programs. 212 seniors (or 23%) are non-admit. Table below shows the distribution by admission/non-admission and state.

A total of 97 graduates from the National Campus, 24 from CTEC), 19 from Chuuk Campus, 14 from Yap Campus, and five from Kosrae Campus.
