COM-FSM Student Body Association Board of Regents Report May – August 2018

CTEC/National Campus Updates:

During the months of May through August, a variety of events were held in conjunction with National Campus and the Career & Technical Educational Center. Below are some of the major highlights, as identified by the students:

- The main event in May was a Luau celebration held on Saturday, May 5th. This event was meant to congratulate students for all the hard work they have put forth this semester both in and out of the classroom, as well as, assisting with the 25th Anniversary Celebrations. This event, which featured music, entertainment, and a photo booth, aimed to be environmentally friendly. Students from the various cultural groups helped out in providing locally sourced supplies, utilizing coconuts leaves for both decoration purposes, as well as, serving plates.
