JULY 21, 2021: GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY FOR CTEC MULTI-PURPOSE TECHNICAL CLASSROOM AND SHOP

Vice President for Administrative Services (VPAS) along with the facilities & maintenance staff at the both National Campus and the Career & Technical Education Center (CTEC) arranged for the groundbreaking ceremony that took place at the site where the CTEC Multi-Purpose Technical Classroom & Shop will be built at the CTEC upper campus.

Dignitaries in attendance were Mr. Andrew Postner, Public Affairs Officers of the US Embassy in the FSM, who represented the US ambassador; Hon. Carl D. Apis, Secretary of the FSM Department of Transportation, Communication and Infrastructure (TC&), who represented the FSM president1; HE Jo Cowley, Australian Ambassador to the FSM; HE Huang Zheng, Ambassador of the People's Republic of China to the FSM; Hon. Gardenia Aisek, Secretary of the FSM Department of Education; Hon. Kemsky Sigrah, Administrator of the FSM Compact Management; Mr. Robert Goodwin of the FSM Program Management Unit (PMU); Hon. Peteriko Hairens, Public Affairs Officer, who represented the governor of Pohnpei State; COM-FSM Board of Regent (BOR) Chair, Ms. Suzanne L. Gallen; Ms. Pelma J, Mingii, COM-FSM BOR Secretary-Treasurer; Ms. Morehna Rettin Santos of the Micronesia Red Cross Society; Mr. Richard Adams of ABCOR Engineering and Construction; and a representative from the Japan Embassy in the FSM.

The college's Interim President Karen Simion and BOR Chair Suzanne L. Gallen made remarks on that day thanking the government of the US for the funding of the building and the members of the diplomatic corps for supporting the college development.

The Honorable Peteriko Hairens welcomed everyone to the ceremony. FSM Department of TC&I Carl D. Apis thanked the US government for the project funding assistance and the overall benefits of the building to the manpower development for the FSM in the technical fields.

Infrastructure development projects funder under Compact II

Groundbreaking for the CTEC Multi-Purpose Technical Classroom and Shop took place on July 21, 2021. The project contract is in the amount of \$5.38 million. Contractor ABCOR Engineering and Construction has already started clearing the project site. Project commencement is September 1, 2021, and scheduled to be completed end of August 2023.



Chuuk Campus Project

The FSM-PMU office has not been able to release the Request For Proposal (RFP) for rescoping for the Chuuk Campus due to border closing. Now that the restrictions may be relaxed soon, the RFP will be issued. However, according to FSM PMU, the road access to the new campus will be included in the ADB road project funding being worked on. Emanuel Mori, COM-FSM Executive Director for Institutional Advancement and External Affairs (IAEA), visited Chuuk State for business trip and spent time with the new Governor and Legislative leadership and learned about Chuuk State's efforts to resolve the land dispute on the access road to the site. The new administration has committed itself to resolving the court case as soon as possible.

National Campus Student Center

Due to the increase in cost of construction the project has been placed on hold waiting for additional funding.

Request has been made to congress to appropriate the balance of the national government's share of IDP funds in the amount of \$1,377,981.00 to supplement the available budget for the project. During the July congress session the congress did not act on the matter and requested more information from the Budget Office.

National Campus Teaching Clinic

Pohnpei State Governor Reed B. Oliver has transmitted the request for \$2.5 million to Pohnpei State Legislature to fund the the project. In addition a bill for an act to appropriate the funds has been introduced by the legislature.

Kosrae Campus Multi-Purpose Building

No update relating to the funding request of \$3.5 million made to the Kosrae State Government relating to this project.

Career & Technical Education Center: HTM Building renovation

Completion date has been set for September 10, 2021. Grand opening ceremony has been tentatively scheduled for October 15, 2021, at 10:00 AM. The total renovation cost plus fixed furniture and equipment is \$276,044.60.



Projects funded under Infrastructure Maintenance Funds

The following projects funded under the IMF are being implemented:

- Chuuk Campus library roof replacement
- CTEC classrooms 1-4 roof replacement
- CTEC administration building floor replacement

Maintenance Projects

- Roofing of the container for Business Office
- Request For Proposal (RFP) is being prepared for the roofing of the COM-FSM and China Friendship Demonstration Farm's containers.

Energy reduction

Replacement of air conditioner (AC) units is still ongoing with the most recent replacements at Chuuk Campus. Data on usage is not currently available for reporting.

COVID-19 preventive measures

- Hand sanitizer stations are being installed at the National Campus and CTEC.
- Contract for the fencing of National Campus is being routed for signature, The project is funded by the CARES act funds.
- Request for Proposal (RFP) for the fencing of Yap Campus and Kosrae Campus will be released no later August 26, 2021.
- Request for Quotation (RFQ) for generators and control panels have been forwarded to vendors from abroad. Sizes of generators are as follows: 120 KW for Kosrae Campus and 176 KW for CTEC upper campus and Yap Campus.
- Plans to realign the secondary power service at Kosrae Campus have been prepared by KUA. Plans for Yap campus secondary power distribution system is still in progress, while CTEC

COLLEGE AWARDS \$1.374M PELL GRANT TO 100% OF THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT ENROLLED LAST SUMMER 2021

The college's Financial Aid Office (FAO) reported that it awarded \$1,374,092.00 Pell Grant to 937 students or 100% of the Pell-

eligible students enrolled last summer 2021. Table below shows the distribution by campus.

1,917 students registered for fall 2021

The college has a fall 2021 enrollment¹ of 1,917 head counts with 21,863 registered credits, which is equivalent to 1,822 full-time equivalent students.

According to the college's registrar, "If compared to last fall 2020, the college has seen an increase in its college-wide enrollment in head counts and registered credits (or FTE) by 3% and 3%, respectively. Vis-à-vis fall 2020 enrollment, National Campus has seen an 18% increase in its head count enrollment, and 20% increase in its registered credit enrollment." Table below shows the distribution by campus.

The college's registrar further reported that the college-wide fall 2021 enrollment in headcounts and registered credits are below the enrollment targets for fall 2021 by 3% and 11%, respectively. The enrollment targets provide the college data on revenue projections which are used to guide annual budget development. Yap Campus has surpassed its fall 2021 targets in head counts and registered credits by 35% and 32%, respectively. While Chuuk Campus exceeded its fall 2021 target in head counts by 13%, it is behind its target in registered credits by 3%. Table below shows the distribution by campus.

A college-wide average credits of 11.40, which is 3% lower than the target college-wide average credits for fall 2021 term. By campus and vis-à-vis their targets in average credits:

National Campus has 12.43 credits, which is 3% lower than its target. CTEC has 11.50, which is 5% higher that its target.

- Chuuk Campus has 10.18, which is 14% lower than its target.
- Kosrae Campus has 9.07, which is 10% lower than its target.


centralizing the upper campus secondary power system is part of the CTEC Multi-Purpose Technical Building contract.
