Three COM-FSM students returned after attending an annual convention for the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society in Seattle during April 7 – 9, 2011. Steen Harris, Fritzgerald Weilbacher and Dayn lehsi are members of the local chapter of the society called the Beta Omicron Upsilon. The three participants attended six rounds of educational forums with many choices of topics ranging from Phi Theta Kappa programming and benefits to personal development. The students engaged in forums on effective professional etiquette, leadership development programs, and effective public relations strategies. According to Mariana Ben Dereas, an advisor for the local chapter, the criteria for choosing the three students were based on three categories which include an

essay on why should they be chosen and how the convention will benefit them as members of PTK, an evaluation of the participant's grade point average, and if the participant is active in the society's activities throughout the year. The Phi Theta Kappa is the largest honor society in American higher education with more than 2 million members and 1,200 chapters located in all 50 of the United States, US territories, British Virgin Islands, Canada, Germany, Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, United Arab Emirates and Palau. Currently the COM-FSM's Beta Omicron Upsilon Chapter of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society has more than 40 active members.

College Optimistic After Accreditation Team Visit

The three-member visiting team completed their April 11-13 visitation of the college as specified in the June 30, 2010, action letter that placed the college on warning status. According to the Accreditation Liaison Officer (ALO), Mr Jon Berger, the team from the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) seemed very pleased with the college and they often made positive comments. The visitors interviewed 16 members of the college community. According to the ALO, the interviews were thorough and the team members asked detailed questions. Mr Berger also said that the visitors also requested documented evidence about what the college has done to resolve the recommendations. The visit concluded with a meeting between the team chair and the interim president. Most of the comments from the team chair revolved around the various plans of the college and the work that still needs to be done with the plans. The team

also noted that communication has improved at the college and reminded the interim president that accreditation is not an event but a process. According to the ALO, the final comment by the team chair to the interim president was that the college is "on track". The team chair will put together a report of their findings and submit it to the commission prior to their June 2011 meeting. According to the ALO, the college must continue to

resolve all recommendations based on the commission's two-year rule. For the college, the end of the twovear rule would be 2012. The team is chaired by Sandra Serrano, the Chancellor of the Kern Community College District. The other team members include Douglas Dykstra, the Chancellor of Windward Community College and Sean James, the Vice Chancellor of Operations Management at the Kern Community College District.

program is designed to provide short-term research education and training for high school students and college students from racial/ ethnic groups underrepresented in biomedical and behavioral backgrounds from the islands in the region. The purpose of the program is to expose student participants to research in the NIDDK mission areas, including diabetes, endocrinology, metabolism, nutrition, obesity, and digestive, live urologic, kidney and hematologic diseases.

College Receives Japan Aid for Yap Pork Production

The college received a \$53,000 grant from the Government of Japan to address constraints in swine production for Yap's Nel Village. The signing of the testimony and handover of the check took place at the National Campus on March 28, 2011, between COM-FSM Interim President Ringlen Ringlen and Ambassador of Japan to the FSM Eiichi Suzuki.

According to Ambassador Suzuki, his government fully understands the critical need for communities to protect their food supplies and to improve food security. He was pleased that the grant they provided fits well with the community level programs of the College of Micronesia-FSM.

The goal of the project is to assist the community of Yap's Nel Village in increasing the pork production through the use of improved local pig diet. The Nel community will directly benefit from this project by increasing their knowledge and skills in swine nutrition and husbandry.

The financial assistance provided through the grant will enable the community to build appropriate pigpens and purchase the equipment and materials for developing local feeds. The Nel project is spearheaded by Extension Agent Steven Young Uhk of Yap Campus.

COM-FSM Entrance Test (COMET) FAQ's

Continuation From Volume 4 issue 2 10. If I am a high school senior or a high school graduate and I have official SAT, ACT, or TOEFL scores, can I use these scores to be considered for admissions to COM-FSM, or do I still need to take the COMET?

At this time, the college has no established policy or procedure for admitting students based only on SAT, ACT, or TOEFL scores. For now, the college is handling requests on a case by case basis. Nonetheless, the college welcomes applications for admission and will consider your application. If you are in the FSM, plan to take the COMET. If you are attending high school outside of the FSM and plan to return to the FSM to attend COM-FSM and cannot take the COMET, you should contact the college early about your plans. You will need to submit an application, report your SAT, ACT, or TOEFL scores to COM-FSM, and have an official copy of your high school transcript sent to the college For more information or assistance in applying from outside the FSM, please contact any of the state campuses, or e-mail the VPSS at vpssa@comfsm.fm or the Registrar of the college atjoducado@comfsm.fm.

11. How can students and schools best prepare for the COMET test?

There is not "quick and easy" way to best prepare

to score well on the COMET. The goal of the COMET is to get an indication of how prepared the student is to read, write and compute at a college level. His/her success on the COMET therefore is the result of the skills the student has developed from K-12. Be familiar with how to use machine scored answer sheets. Be familiar with test taking strategies for using time well, etc. COM-FSM also recommends test takers become familiar with the essay test requirements and practice writing essays. Ask the college for a sample of the essay scoring rubric. Be aware that the essay test score is a major portion of the final COMET score and that test takers need to put their best effort into this section.

12. Where can I get more information about admissions requirements, taking the COMET, and applying to COM-FSM?

Call, or stop by the COM-FSM campus in your state. Check the college website atwww.comfsm.fm, and e-mail the Office of Admissions and Records atjoducado@comfsm.fm or Office of the VP for Student Services, vpssa@comfsm.fm. to determine best placement into appropriate level courses.
