2011 Fall semester graduates from National and Pohnpei Campuses listen carefully to keynote address.

Dr Rufino Mauricio from the Office of National Archives Culture and Historic Preservation was the keynote speaker. According to information from the college, 170 students graduated from the college's national and state campuses during spring 2011: 15 from Chuuk Campus; 11 from Kosrae Campus; 109 from National Campus; 16 from Pohnpei Campus and 19 from Yap Campus.

2011 Summer Enrollment Higher than Projected

As of Monday June 6, 2011, the total number is expecting a full-time equivalent count of registered students at the College's National Campus reached a total 906. On a full-time equivalent basis, this equates to about 875 full-time students. The National Campus alone projects an enrollment of 568 full-time students. As of June 6, the National Campus has 307 more full-time students than projected.

The summer registration for National and Pohnpei campuses officially kicked off on May 25, 2011, and officially ended on June 2, 2011. These numbers are subject to change until registration and the adddrop of courses are complete. According to information released from the Institutional research and planning office, the college

Board to Request Supplemental Funding from Congress

The COM-FSM Board of Regents at their March 14-15, 2011, meeting agreed to request supplemental funding from the FSM Congress. The supplemental request is to cover the expenses associated with the board's reflection sessions for this fiscal year, the presidential search committee and the services of a consultant to help the college understand more about how college foundations work. **Students Now Have Option**

to Pay Only \$15 during Registration

The Board of Regents acted to require students to pay only \$15 during registration instead of the original \$50. According to the college, the original \$50 that students were required to pay during registration includes a registration fee of \$15, a health fee of \$15 and

an activity fee of \$20. Instead of requiring students to pay for the entire amount during registration, student

now have the option to only pay the registration fee of \$15 during registration. The health and activity fees may be paid after the student receives his or her financial aid award. **COM-FSM Employment Contract Policy is Updated** Section VII of the COM-FSM Personnel Manual is now updated as reported by the

college's human resources

director. The changes are as follows: Section 2aii now lists

"grant period of externally funded projects" as another cause why a renewal contract may be shorter

Section 2bi now makes explicit that the services to be performed under personal service contracts are "temporary in nature" and does not lead to a regular employment. New section 2bvi states that "special contract used to fill vacancy positions are limited to six months and may not be renewed". An amendment to section 3 regarding contract renewals now states that "notification to the employees must be provided at least 60 days prior to the expiration date of the contract. Likewise, if the employee decides not to renew his contract,

at least 60 davs prior notice must be provided to the College. Instructional Department Holds Workshop for

Faculty and Staff

Instructional coordinators, several academic division chairs and several members of the college faculty took part in a four-day workshop that centered on assessment, the Achieving College Excellence Program and the department's decision grids. Participants from all six campuses took part in the May 9 - 12 workshop sessions in Pohnpei. According

to Karen Simion, the Director of Academic Programs, the department needs to update its decision grids to reflect the recent structure and reporting changes as mandated by the college's board of regents through the recent job audit and streamlining recommendations.

Scientists Assess **Agricultural Activities in** Pohnpei

A group of six University of Hawaii scientists and specialists visited Pohnpei in April and conducted agricultural researches. This first trip was for fact finding and assessment of agricultural activities in Pohnpei. Information gathered during the trip will be used for developing workshops on agriculture in Pohnpei.

According to Jackson Phillp of the Cooperative Research and Extension Services, the group

will return to Pohnpei to conduct the workshops on August 8 – 12, 2011. The group also visited farmers in the Pohnpei areas of Kitti, Sokehs, Kolonia and Nett. They gave hands on training on soil sample collection for the National and Pohnpei campuses Agriculture and Food Technology students.

Covered Walkway Project to Begin in June

Dorm Students Attend Retreat at Penieu Island



Pohnpei Campus Hosts Arboriculturist Training QUANTITATIVEANDSCIENTIFICREASONING:


COM-FSM Pohnpei Campus recently hosted a one-week arbor culturist training through the efforts and financial support of the US Forest Service and FSM Forestry leadership. This is the study of individual trees, shrubs, vines, and other perennial woody plants. The 20 participants were introduced to education and training programs in practices for proper tree selection, planting, care and climbing. The program was attended by professionals from

Pohnpei Forestry, Kolonia Town, COM-FSM, Yap, Kosrae, Chuuk and Palau. The program was coordinated and administered by Merins Hadley-Race of the Pohnpei Campus Training Institute and was conducted by Kevin Eckert of Arbor Global, a Hawaii-based tree consulting and training company, and Dr Phil Cannon, a Forest Pathologist for the US Forest Service. Participants received 5 full days of education in tree biology, tree selection and planting, tree care practices, proper pruning, risk assessment and mitigation, tree diseases and disorders, tree protection and preservation, tree-climbing and safe work practices. Following the education program, 12 of the

participants qualified for and sat for the International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Certified Arborist examination. A tree climbing training program was also conducted that included eight of the professionals who attended the arborist education program. The US Forest Service purchased and donated tree climbing equipment to the FSM to ensure that students could use the best equipment and conduct their work safely. Training included all of the key skills and practices required to install ropes high into trees, most easily climb far above the ground, and safely maneuver and work throughout the tree crown.
