ROTC Cadets Begin Training of COM-FSM Upward Bound Students

A Memorandum of Understanding signed by the College of Micronesia-FSM (COM-FSM) Upward Bound Program at Pohnpei Campus and the U.S. Army Cadet Command began a three-week training of Upward Bound students by U.S. Army ROTC Cadets. Eight U.S. Army Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) Cadets began instructing students at the Pohnpei Island Central School (PICS) in English, math, science, and physical training from June 26 to July 13, 2012. This cooperation is the first-ever U.S. Army Cultural Understanding and Language Proficiency Program (CULP) in the Federated States of Micronesia. The Cadets are under the command of U.S. Army Lieutenant Colonel Michael Feret, CULP Program Coordinator to the FSM. On Monday, June 25, COM-FSM President Joseph M. Daisy, Ed.D., Upward Bound staff Steven Yarofalig on behalf of Director Diaz Joseph, and Acting

Pohnpei Campus Dean Maria Dison signed the MOU with Lieutenant Colonel Feret, welcoming the CULP Visit Summer 2012 program to begin its mission in Pohnpei. The eight ROTC Cadets providing the training for the Upward Bound students are currently working towards their bachelor degrees. The Cadets and university

College Joins Pohnpei to Welcome Japan Visitors

The College of Micronesia-FSM was among the organizations and groups that welcomed the visitors from Japan who visited Pohnpei on June 9 through June 13, 2012. The visitors came on the first direct flight from Japan to the FSM after the extension of the Pohnpei International Airport runway; a project funded by the Japanese Overseas Development Assistance. With the assistance of a translator, the college translated a brochure about the college into Japanese as well as provided Japanese subtitles for its short video on the lives of students at the college, to promote

the college and its endowment fund. On June 10, the college set up a booth at the Spanish Wall Park along with other groups and vendors. Staff from the college Bookstore and the Development and Community Relations Office played the Japanese subtitled video, gave away brochures and sold college merchandise to the visitors. A translator was also present at the booth who provided translation services for those who visited the college's booth. The college gave away over 100 brochures to the visitors.

GEAR UP to Hold Summer Program at Kolonia Elementary School

The GEAR UP program will hold a summer school at Kolonia Elementary School starting on June 13 and ending on July 17, 2012. The summer program will be made up of three rounds of 10-day sessions focusing on educational preparedness and higher education awareness activities for students. GEAR UP teachers will be instructing students in math, technology and providing activities for increasing career awareness, self-esteem and motivation. Three hundred-fifty students are expected to take part in the summer program. For the first time, the program will feature a mentoring component for college-bound GEAR UP students in learning communities to provide more peer-to-peer support group assistant. Field trips, community service activities, student workshops and guest lectures by invited speakers will also take place.

Secretaries Attend Website Update Training

College secretaries from the National Campus took part in a training session last June 19, 2012 on how to post information to the college website directly. The training is part of a series of improvement activities to make the college's website the primary information hub for the college. More students are relying on the college's website as their main information source for the college. The training will enable other offices and programs of the college to directly post their announcements and information to the college website. Currently, only the staff from the Information Technology and Development and Community Relations offices have direct access to update the website. With the new change, each office or program of the college will have the access and skillset to post announcements and share information to the entire college community from their duty stations. This accessibility will be available from anywhere in the world where Internet services are available. The training is part of a series of trainings developed to farm out direct access to update parts of the college website to people responsible for providing services at the college. The

current training is only focusing on direct posting of announcement and information to the website. Further training sessions will focus on major content upload. The same training for campus secretaries took at Pohnpei Campus on June 20, 2012, and eventually at other campuses. The participants of the training at the National Campus included Hadleen Hadley, Sinobu Lebehn, Josephine Kostka, Mary Allen Manuel, Julia Eldridge, and Yolina Yamada. The training was conducted by Webmaster Shaun Suliol, and Development and Community Relations staff Joseph Saimon.

MITC Coordinator To Conduct Pacific Digital Library Training

The COM-FSM Media and Instructional Technology Center (MITC) coordinator departed Pohnpei last June 25, 2012, to conduct a digital library training as part of the Kosrae Education Conference. MITC Coordinator, Karleen Manuel Samuel, conducted the training for librarians and educators on the Pacific Digital Library (PDL) project. Karleen serves as the technical director of the PDL project, managing all information technology aspects of the project, as well as preparing and editing scanned files sent from other librarians in the region before uploading to the PDL website. PDL is part of the Strategic Learning Communities (SLC) project funded by the U.S. Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), and administered by Pacific Resources for Education and Learning (PREL). Ms. Jane Barnwell, PREL Director of Library and Information Literacy Initiatives, has been working alongside Karleen to provide these trainings. The Kosrae training is part of a series of workshops that were held in Palau and Yap in February and most

recently in Majuro this past May. Participants who attend the bookmaking workshop at the Kosrae conference will be encouraged to contribute their work to the PDL, expanding the amount of material available online for children in local languages. The Pacific Digital Library (PDL) is the result of a three-week intensive training on the Greenstone Digital Library software that was held in May 2009, and continues to be maintained and updated through the collaborative effort of a group of Pacific librarians.
