## Note:

- \*There are a few factors that needs to be considered in calculating the rates but we have not been able to incorporate them in the formula yet because of the lack of information/data. Below are some of the information/data we need in order to get an accurate rate for each program and the college:
  - Number of transfers from state campuses to national campus, or other state campuses
  - Number of transfers from the college to other IHEs
- Number of drop-out students
- Number of students who died or became permanently disabled
- Number of students who left school to serve in the armed forces (or have been called up to active duty)
- Number of students who left school to serve with a foreign aid services of the Federal government
- Number of students who left school to serve on an official church mission

## \*IPEDS calculation of Graduation rate:

Rate is calculated as the total number of completers within <u>150% of normal time</u> divided by the total number in cohort minus any <u>allowable exclusions</u>.

- Completers within <u>150% of normal time</u> are students who completed their program in 2 years or less (for certificate programs) and in 2 years or more, but less than 4 years, for 2 year degree programs and third year certificate programs.
- Allowable exclusions are all those listed above. Number of transfer students from the college to other IHEs, drop-out, etc.

<sup>\*</sup> Some programs may not have initial enrollment but have graduates at the end of a term as students change their majors. This made it hard for us to calculate the rate for the program as excel will not execute the formula.
