110.3.4 Describe the application of each joint (4) in a given piece of Furniture.

- 110.4.2 Take measurements from a full size setout and produce a cutting list.**
- 110.4.3 Compile a material list from a cutting list.**
- 110.4.4 Calculate the total cost of a project.**

Manufacture Practical Project

Manufacture a Cabinet and/or piece of Furniture to suit a Domestic Application.

Cabinet

- 110.5.2** **Determine the required sheets and their size for the required components to ensure economical use of materials.**
- 110.5.3** **Machine the components of the cutting list to acceptable furnishing industry standards.**
- 110.5.4** **Assemble the components to an acceptable industry standard.**
- 110.5.5** **Check the Cabinet for size and squareness.**

Piece of Furniture

- 110.5.6** **Compile a cutting list from the drawing and specification provided.**
- 110.5.7** **Determine the required amount of material needed to construct given piece of furniture.**
- 110.5.8** **Machine the components of the cutting list to acceptable furnishing industry standards.**
- 110.5.9** **Assemble the components to an acceptable industry standard.**
- 110.5.10** **Apply industry acceptable finish to project.**
