3) (Feedback) Answers to the \$500 billion dollar question.

Room 1

We are the University of Micronesia (UOM), there are State campuses which are satellites with specialized functions. HTM will take over High Tide restaurant.

We'll have our own cargo vessel and airplane to commute between FSM States.

All VPs rotate around the State campuses to make sure their services and departments are functioning well everywhere.

We have our own data network.

World-class facilities – science lab, a teaching hospital, an upgraded Blue Plate café, and increased personnel, theater and art gallery, gym, weight rooms, pool, soccer fields, and track stadium to hose inter-scholastic sports.

A sophisticated accounting system to track our increased spending, salaries etc. And our own bank, to make processing payments easier.

GO GLOBAL – people come to Micronesia to study abroad – marine science, anthropologoy, sociology – they come for a year or 6 months and rotate around the States.

Increase skilled workers in Tech, Engineering.

Room 2

Same as room 1's ideas but even better!

No matter how rich we are, **resources** will run out – we need to invest to ensure our sustainability.

WE pay for everyone to go to school, come back and teach at COM-FSM, especially nursing and engineers.

Room 3

Complete all the buildings, secure more faculty, increase the level of qualifications. State of the art student centers to meet their needs – a large building student center where students, staff and faculty can hang out, meet, and rest.

We partner with High Schools to oversee technical programs at high schools.

FMI is a competitive marine institute with the capacity to sustainably fish the Exclusive Economic Zone of FSM.

There is a plane to service the college and other local community needs.

We change education overall – we buy *all* the colleges in Micronesia – UOG and GCC and incorporate into together.

When our students come to our university, we provide <u>housing</u> instead of dorms, there is much diversity.

Recreational facilities are excellent, and entrepreneurship activities generate further revenue. We provide financial support to our communities in the form of loans.

Research centers which are relevant to the Pacific: enhanced food production and balance between export and import. The "Maria research institute"

Fully renewable energy.

Encourage better **interactions** with a very good building for conferences, conventions, and meetings.

4) Idea(s) into reality

What can we do today / are we doing today to make some of this reality?

- Improve our programs give time and effort to modify course outlines
- Write grants for upgrading equipment and materials
- Agencies are willing to work with us, eg. JICA & Embassy of Japan to provide a training ship
- Improve career counselling and other student services programs
- Flexible scheduling eg. 16 week semester into 8 weeks / trimesters instead of semesters.
- Online courses equivalent to face-to-face learning no matter whether you do it in 6, 8, or 16 weeks so long as the learning is completed with the same assessments, and regular, substantive interaction with faculty compressed schedule.

It is not always money that is needed to make changes

Normally, people tend to look backwards (at what was done in the past) to think about tomorrow. But we need to change our mindset, we need to know how to learn from the future.
