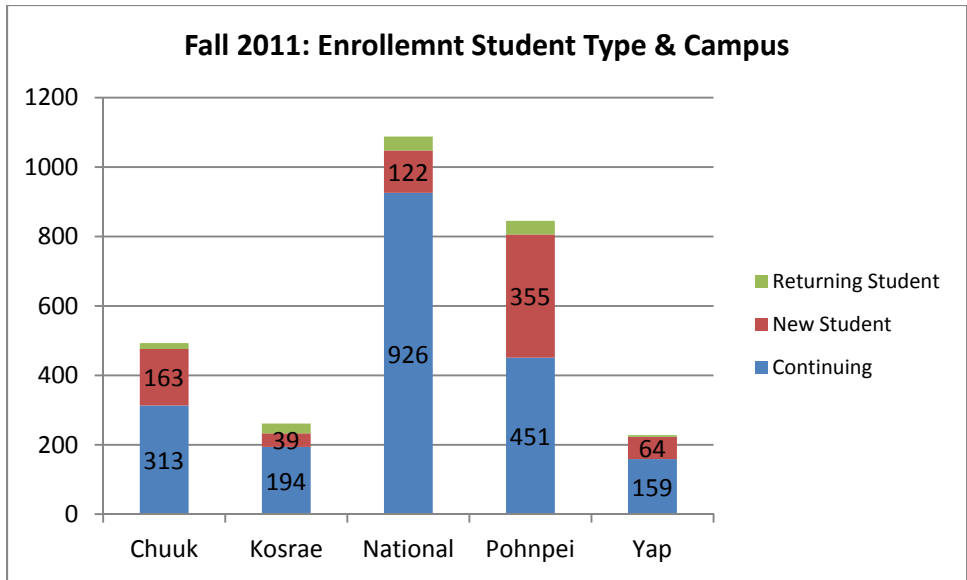


Figure 1 Enrollment by Student Type & Campus

The fall 2011 enrollment represents an approximate increase of 200 students over fall 2010.

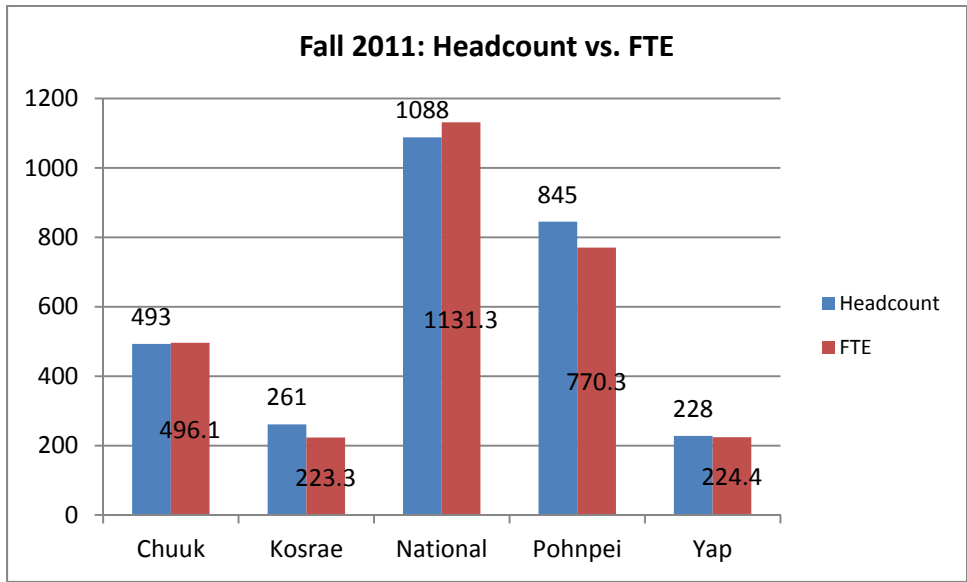


Figure 2 Enrollment Headcount vs. FTE

Full time equivalence (FTE) is determined by dividing total credits by 12 credits. Overall the FTE is slightly less than the headcount for fall 2011 compared to being slightly higher in fall 2010.

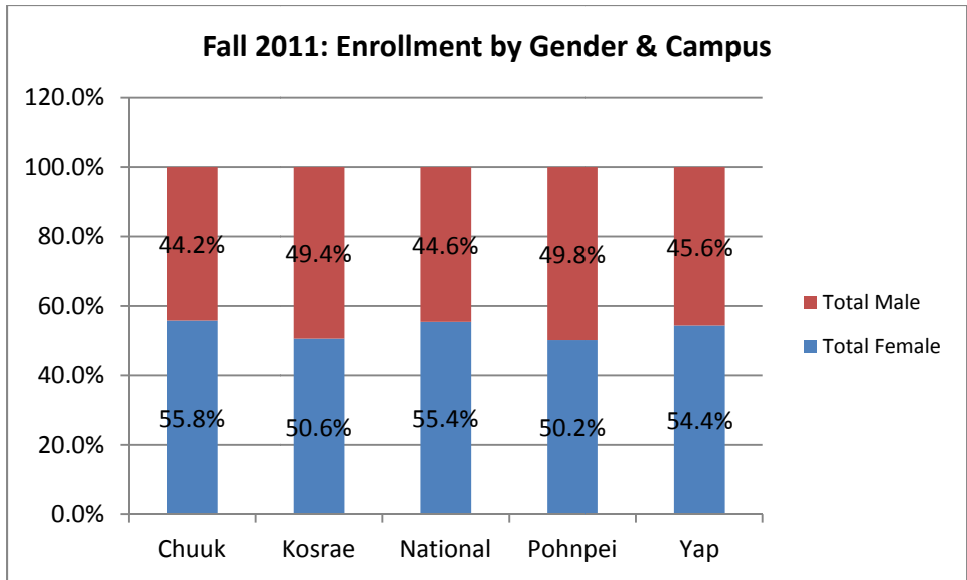


Figure 3: Enrollment by Gender & Campus

Overall females represent 54.3% of the college population. This data is comparable with previous semesters.

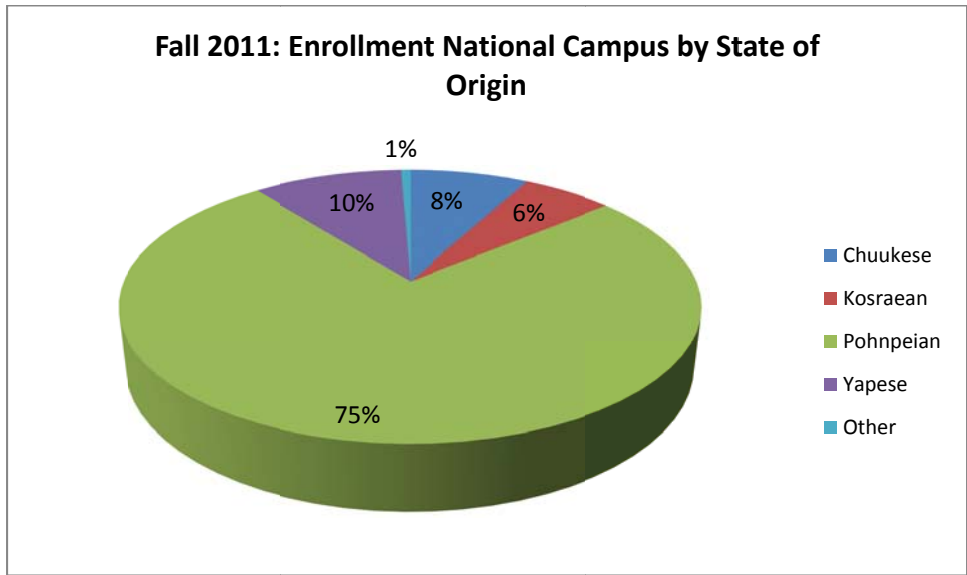


Figure 4 Enrollment National Campus by State of Origin

Pohnpeians continue to represent ~ ¾ of the total enrollment at the national campus. Of note is the 8% Chuukese component of the national campus – their share of the total population in the 2010 census is at 47.4%.

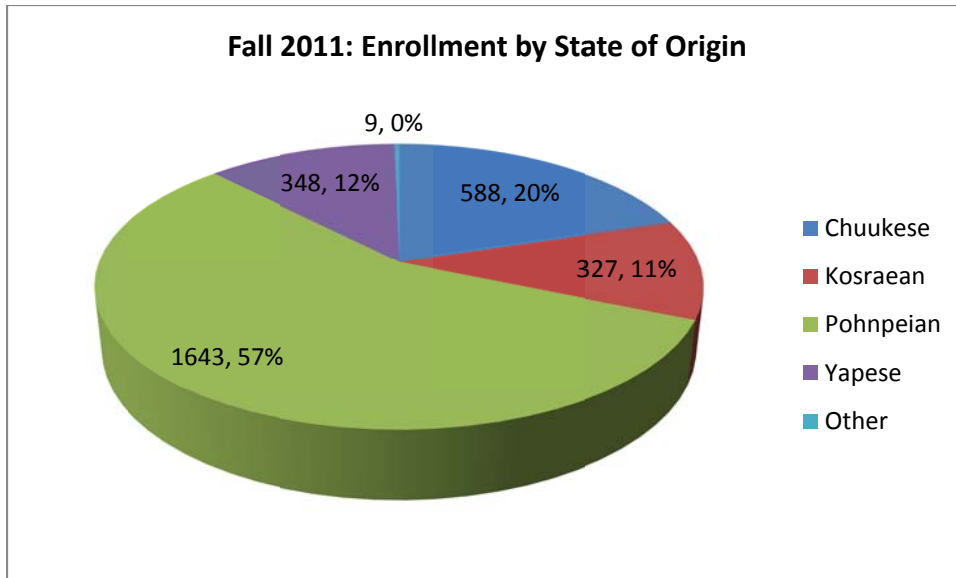


Figure 5 Enrollment College by State of Origin

For comparison purposes FSM population in the 2010 census was 102,624 with Chuuk representing 47.4%, Kosrae 6.4%, Pohnpei 35.1% and Yap at 11.1%. Chuuk enrollment is significantly below their share of the overall FSM population with Kosrae and Pohnpei exceeding.

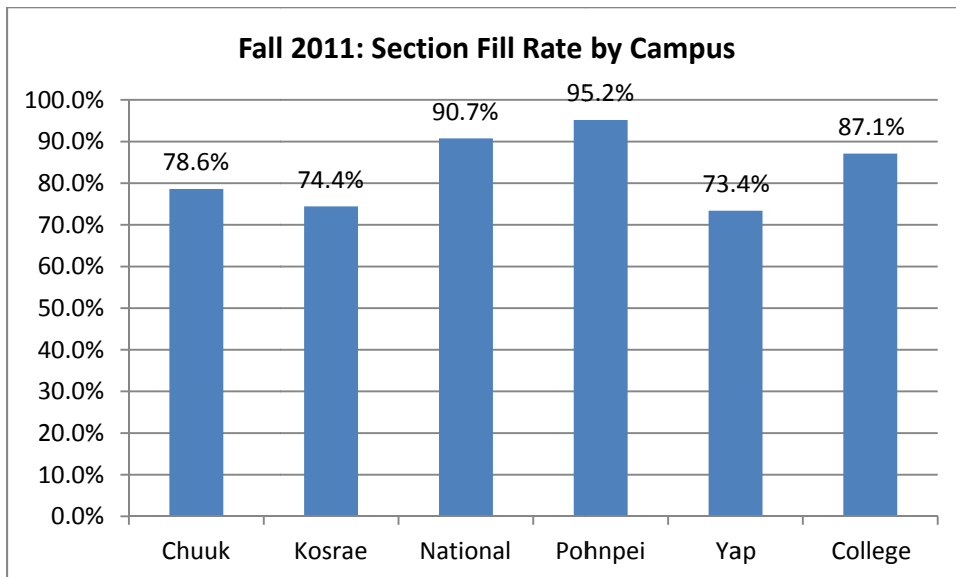


Figure 6 Section Fill Rates by Campus

Section fill rates are the total number of students enrollment in courses at the college divided by the maximum number of slots available in each class. For example, a vocational class may limit enrollment to 15 students due to safety concerns while a history class may have a maximum enrollment of 25 or more.

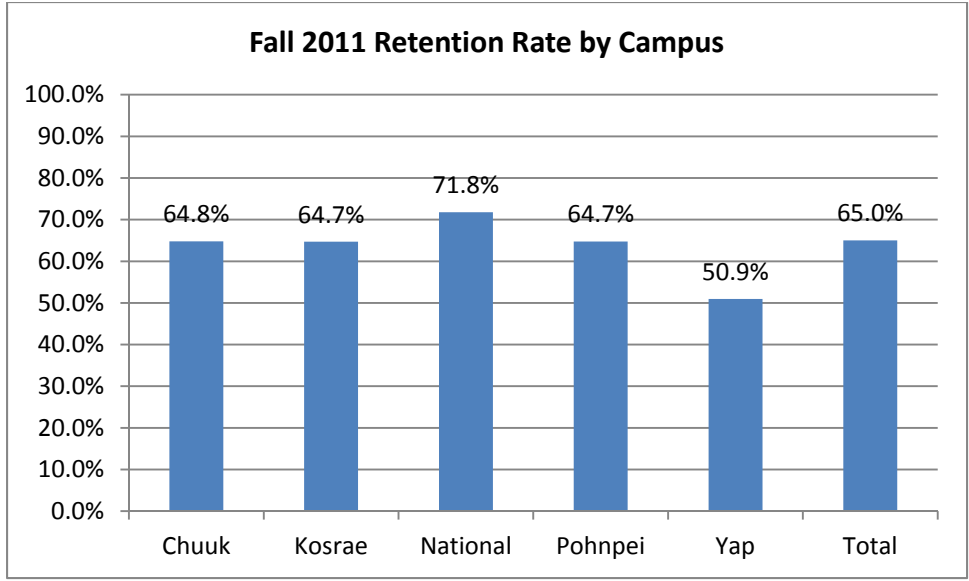


Figure 7 Retention Rates by Campus

Student retention rates represent the per cent of new students in fall 2010 who returned to school in fall 2011. Overall fall 2010 retention rates were 58.8% for all students.

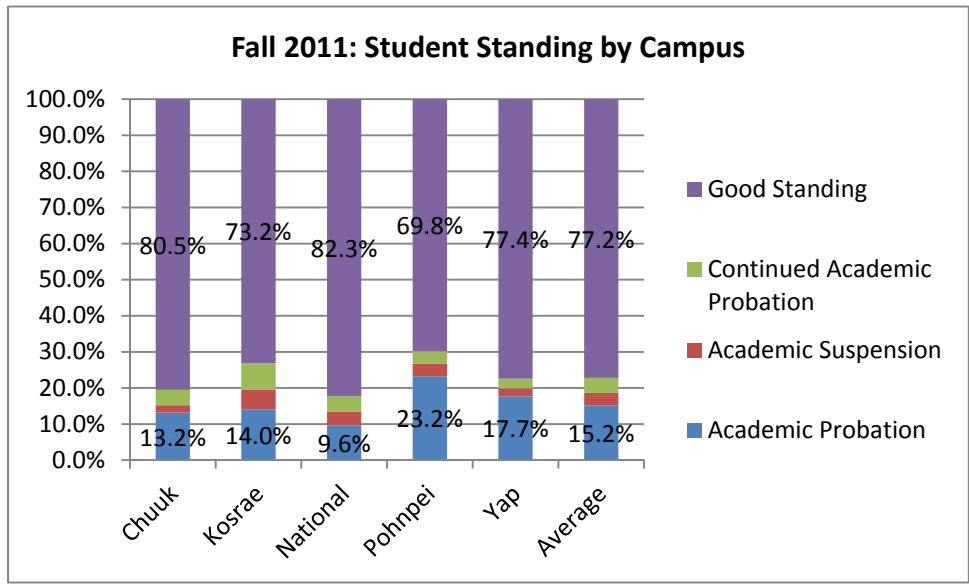


Figure 8 Student Standing by Campus

Good standing is based on students having a Grade Point Equivalent (GPA) of 2.0 or above. Comparative figures for Good Standing in fall 2010 were: Chuuk 82.5%, Kosrae 72.0%, National 83.2%, Pohnpei 71.7% and Yap 83.2%.

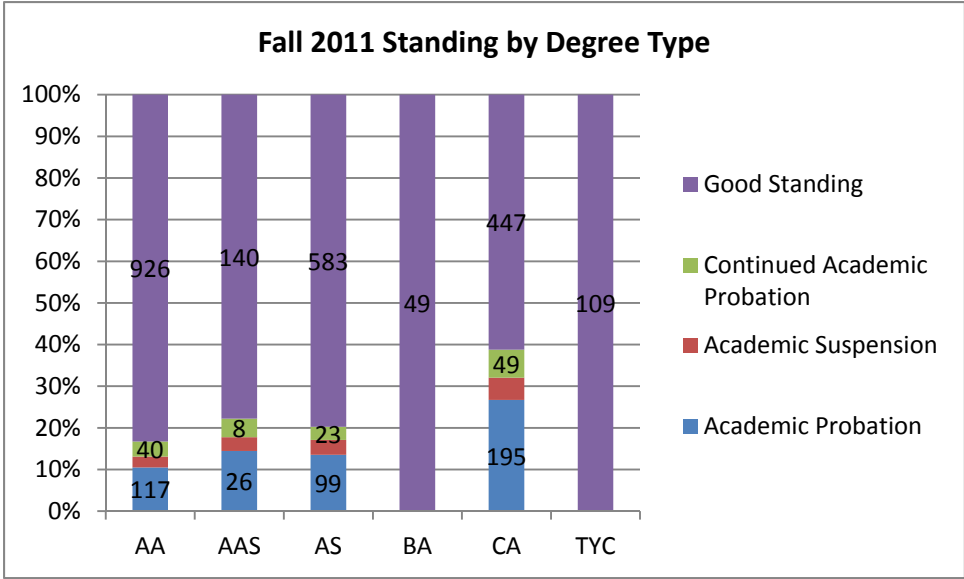


Figure 9 Student Standing by Degree Type

Student standing by degree type shows ~ 38% of students in certificate programs in some type of academic probation or suspension.

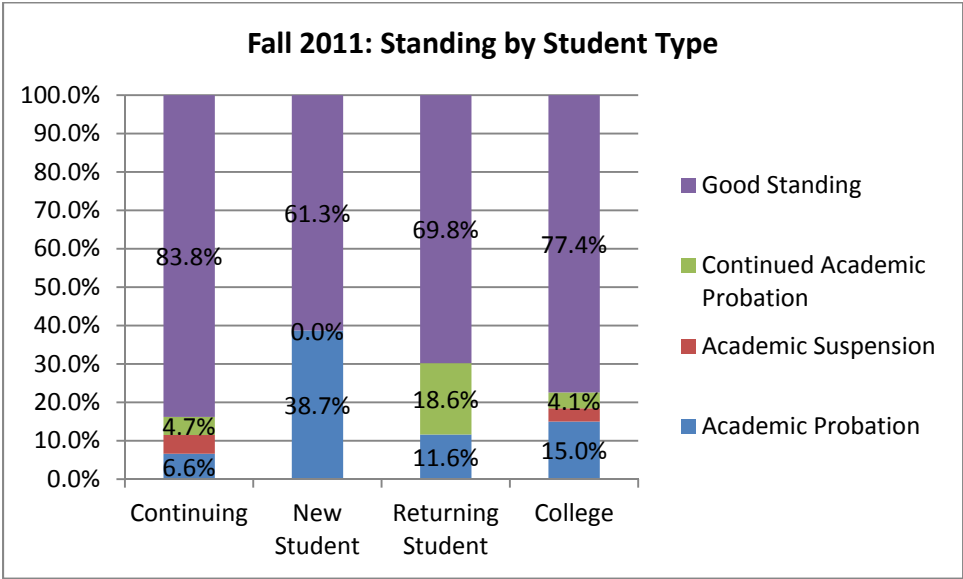


Figure 10 Student Standing by Student Type

Good standing by student type shows 83.8% of continuing students in good academic standing compared to 61.3% for new students.

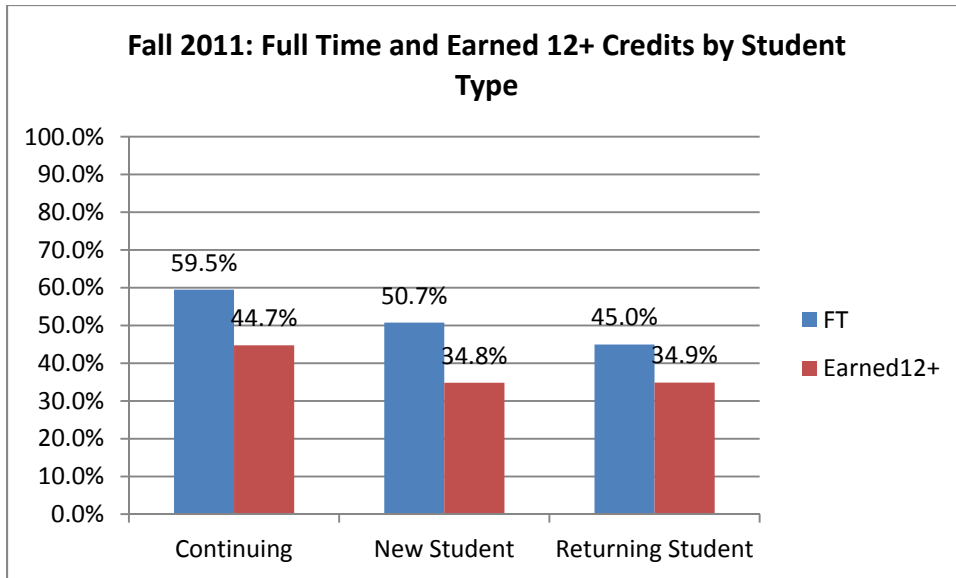


Figure 11 % Full time Students and Earned 12+ Credits by Student Type

Figure 11 provides data on the percent of full time students (students who enrolled in 12+ credits in fall 2011) versus the percent of students who earned 12+ credits. Earning 12+ credits per semester helps put a student on a path to graduate in a reasonable amount of time.

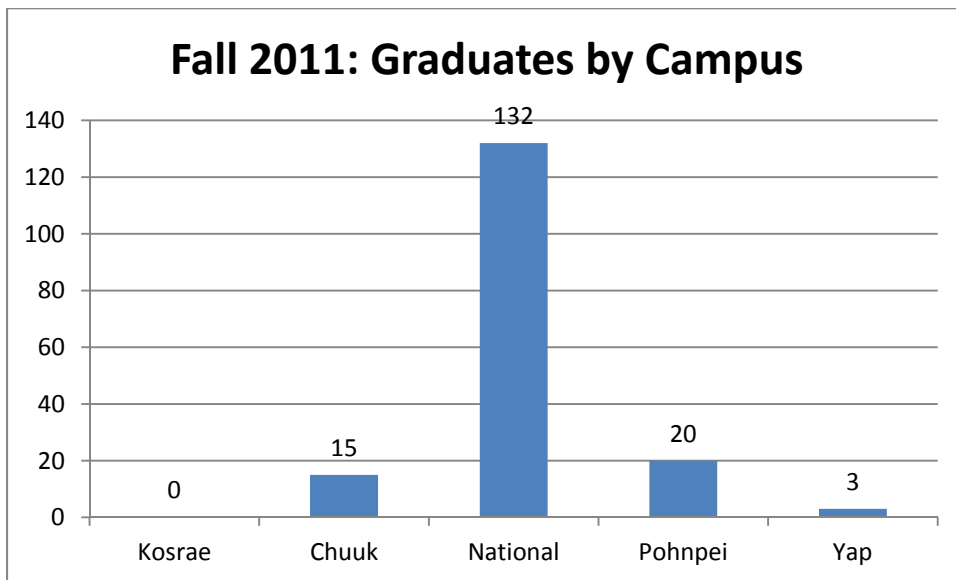


Figure 12 Graduates by Campus

78% of Fall 2011 graduates were from the national campus. There were also 17 graduates of the COM-FSM/UOG Bachelor program in Elementary Education in addition to the college

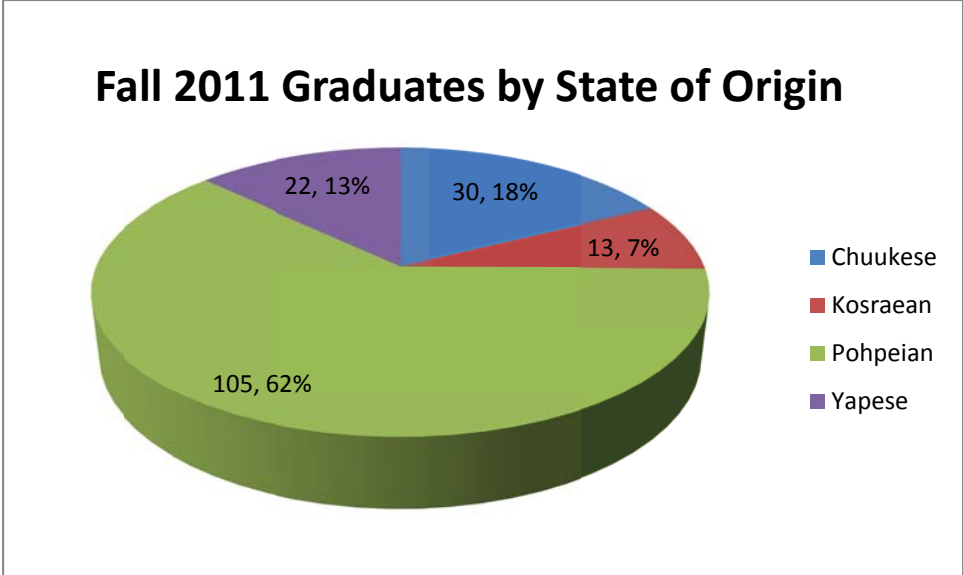


Figure 13 Graduates by State of Origin

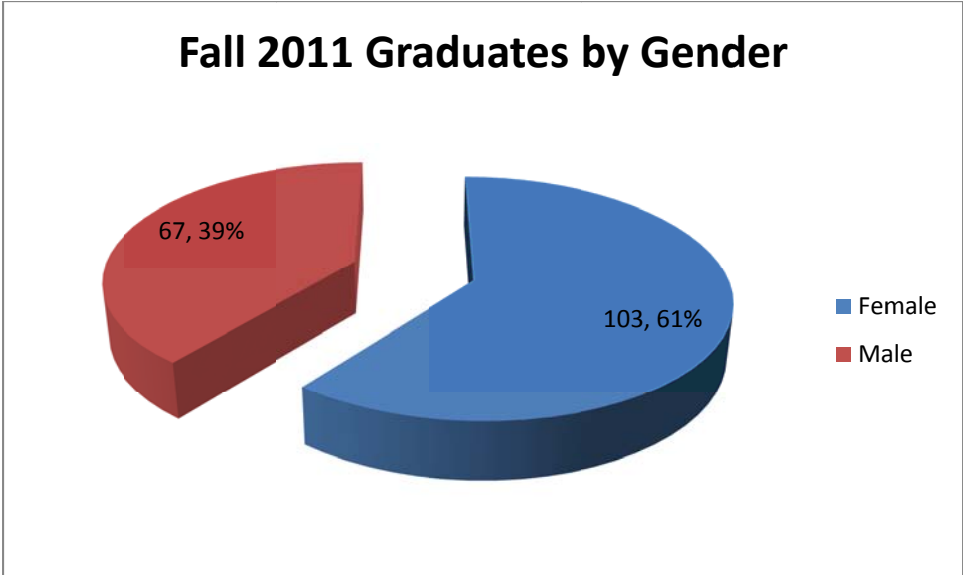


Figure 14 Graduates by Gender

Females represented 54.3% of the overall student population and 61% of graduates.

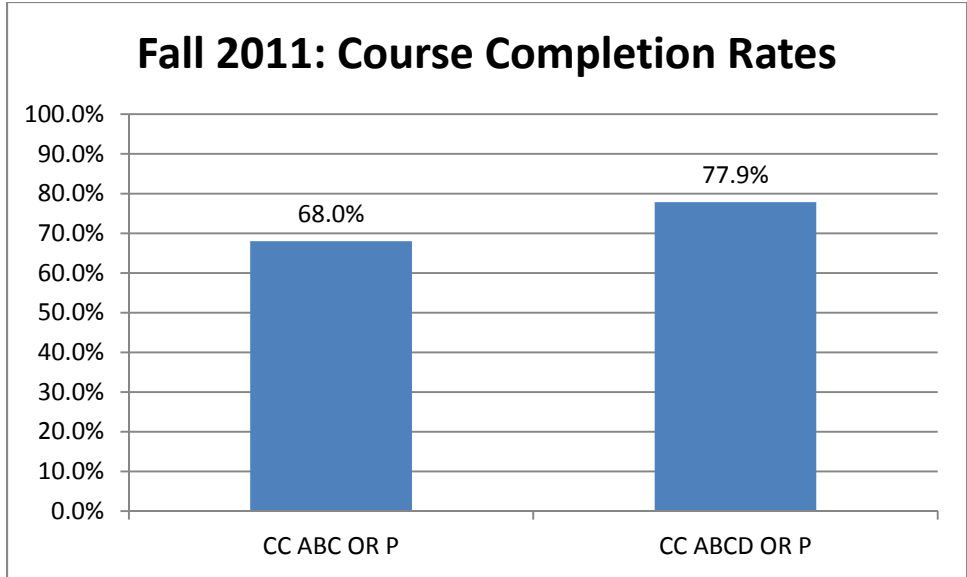


Figure 15 Course Completion Rates ABC& P and ABCD & P

Comparative figures for fall 2010 were 67.9% for ABC&P grades and 78.2% for ABCD&P. Data is provided for both ABC&P and ABCD&P due to the fact that the college catalogue indicates that ABCD are “passing” grades while some programs require some course to have a grade of “C” or better to for a student to obtain credit against program requirements.

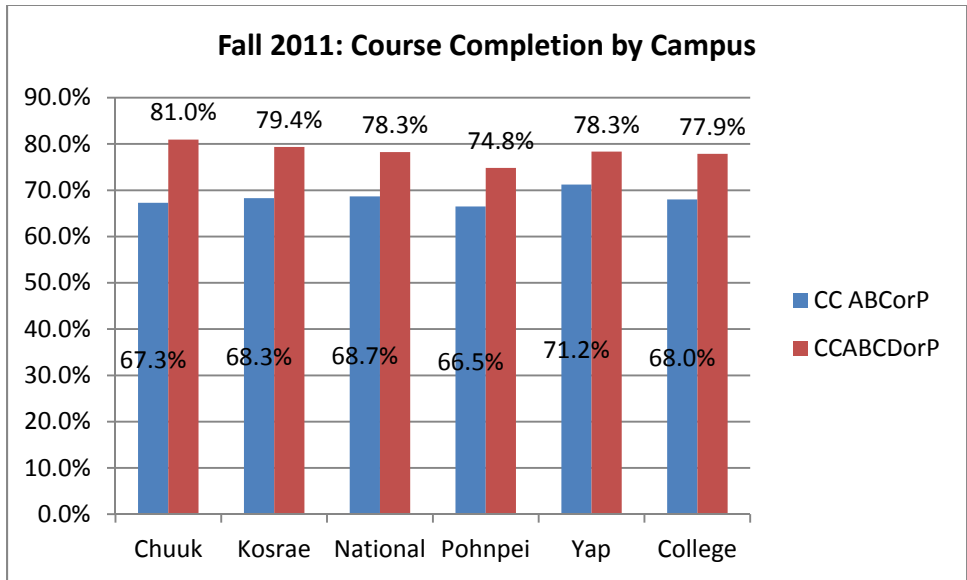


Figure 16 Course Completion Rates by Campus

The college average course completion rate is 68.0% for ABCorP and 77.9% for ABCDorP.

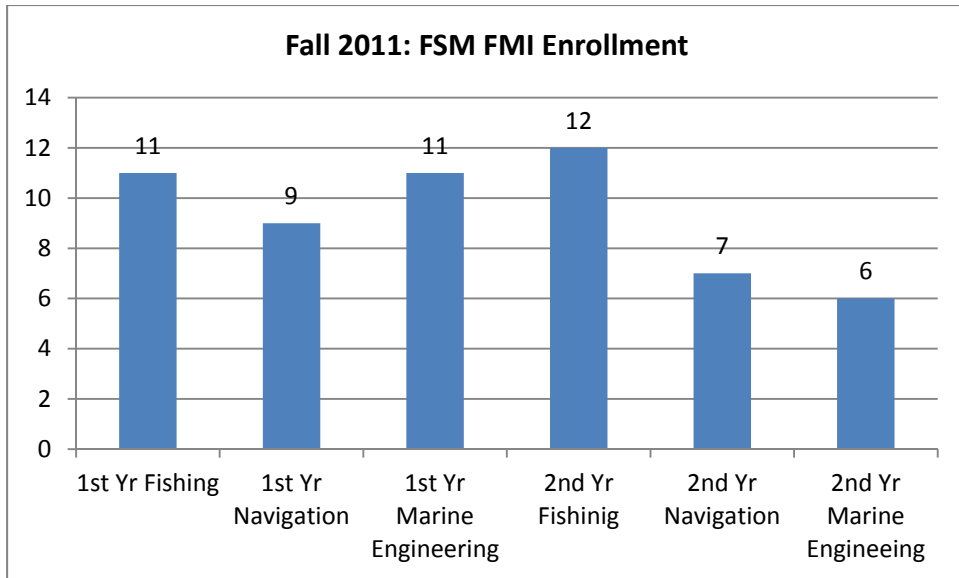


Figure 17 FMI Fall Enrollment

Enrollment at FSM Fisheries and Maritime Institute shows a total enrollment of 56. As all students at FMI are boarding students and there are only 60 beds in the dormitory, the current enrollment rate for FMI is 93%.

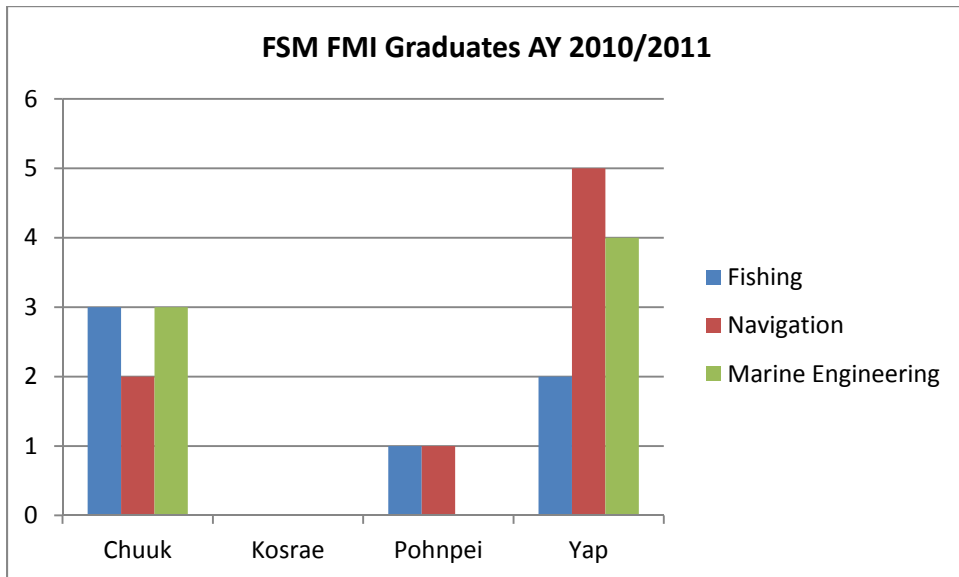


Figure 18 FMI Graduates AY 2010/2011
