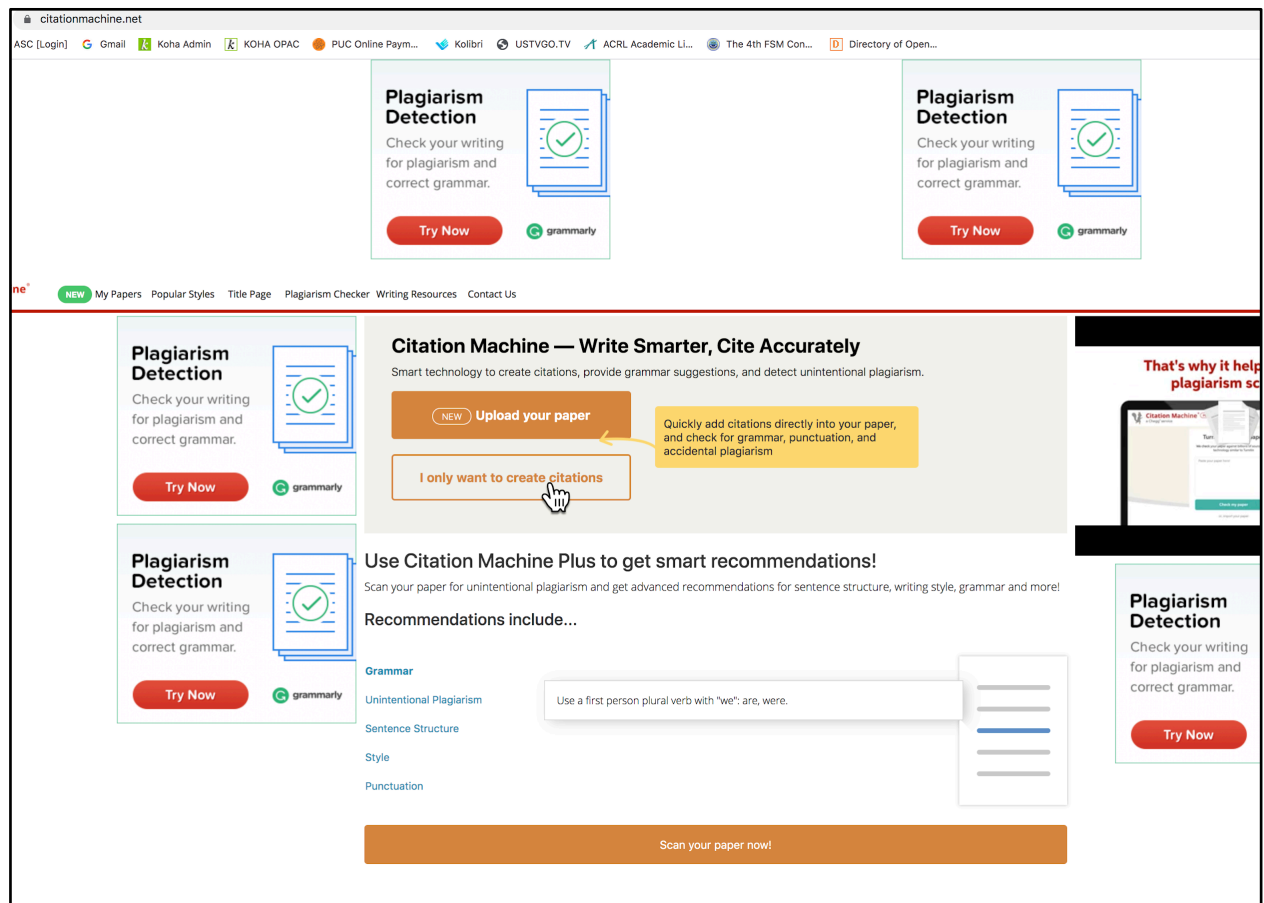


Citing Sources Online - Using Citation Machine

There are a lot of citation websites available. For this tutorial, we will use Citation Machine.

1. Go to <https://www.citationmachine.net/>
2. Select ***I only want to create citations***



3. Choose the citation style or format, either APA or MLA.

Being responsible while researching

- If you select Book, you can do a search for the title, author, or ISBN number to find the exact match to the book you are citing.

6. For example, do a search for ***Exceptional Learners*** and a list will show several books of the same title. Be careful to choose the title that matches your book by checking the **author** and publication **year**. If you see the matching title you are looking for, click the **Select** button next to the title.
