


| Figure 1. Map of FSM States by Boundaries | 6 |

We live in a community where collaboration, open-mindedness, respect and support for each other help us achieve our mission.








Figure 3. Percent of full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students receiving financial aid, by type of aid - 2006-07





Figure 5. Fiscal Year 2008 Projected Revenue & FSM Appropriations





Figure 7. Budget Allocation for Major Functional Areas - FY 2007 to 2010 (Actual Amount)





Figure 9. Core Expenses per FTE enrollment, by function: FY 2007





Figure 11. Full-time equivalent staff by assigned position - Fall 2007



Figure 13. Percent of all students enrolled, by race/ethnicity, and percent who are women - Fall 2007



Figure 14. Enrollment by Campuses - Fall 2008









Figure 18. Percent of Completers by State of Origin – Academic Year 2007-08






Figure 22. COM-FSM Budget Trend – FY 1999 – 2009 (Actual Amounts)




Figure 23. Enrollment Trend – Year 1998-99 to 2008-09




Figure 24. Enrollment Trend - By Fall Terms & Campus - Fall 1998 to Fall 2008




Figure 25. Number of Completers by Academic Year 2000-01 to 2007-08
