Rotarians support the National Spelling Bee Competition:

The Rotary Club of Pohnpei and GEAR UP enrolled GEAR UP schools into the National Spelling Bee competition. The National Spelling Bee competition requires preparation and learning of a specific set of English words. It is an exciting way of learning English, as it culminates with a competition that will, most likely, have some student incentive awards. The students, now, intensively prepare for the first round of competition, which will be conducted at GEAR UP schools in January, 2012. The winners of the school level competition, then, will compete at the municipal level and the winners of the municipal level competition will have a chance to win

the state level competition. It is much hoped by GEAR UP that it will be able to secure funds that will allow the winners of the state level competition to go to Guam on March 3, 2012, and compete against the regional competitors. This would be the first time for Pohnpei to participate in the regional Spelling Bee competition. Rotarians donate bags with school supplies to GEAR UP students:

The Rotary Club of Pohnpei donated 320 bags with variety of school supplies for GEAR UP students and their activities. The students who had 100% GEAR UP after-school program attendance. best high school entrance pretest results and students who were most in need of school supplies received a bag. Overall, 230 students received incentives to keep up their academic achievements. The incentive awards set an example for the ones who need to improve their academic standing. GEAR UP is looking forward to see such improvements from other students at the end of the second quarter.

The event gathered a number of participants whom GEAR UP students had a chance to interview regarding career options. The students tried to clarify professionrelated aspects, such as what higher education opportunities exist; what degree options are available for specific job profiles; what did the participants study in order to get their current jobs; and what the students need to study now to prepare for higher education. It's proven that the earlier students start thinking about higher education, the better they can prepare for it. GEAR UP hopes that its 8th graders now understand the importance of preparation for higher education.

learned a new approach to science utilizing the 5E Model, an internationally recognized model for instructing science. The teachers viewed several case study videos and discussed in think-pair-share and whole group discussions how they can use the information from the videos in their daily and after-school programs. More importantly, IOM partnered with GEAR UP and provided the teachers with future IOM lessons. As a group, the teachers contributed to the development of the lessons and acted as experts in designing instruction for students in science. The success of the training is evident in the current IOM/GEAR UP partner-
