
## **Internal Environmental Scan**

#### **Historical Enrollment**

The College has experienced a 16% increase in enrollment since 2007. During those years the student population has reached as high as 2913 in 2011 and a low of 2366 in 2007. There was a 5% decrease in enrollment from fall 2011 to fall 2012. Fall 2009 and fall 2012 have almost the same enrollment at close to 2750 students.



## Historic enrollment by major




# **Student Demographic Profile**

# **Student Origins by State**

A little more than half the student population at COM-FSM is Pohnpeian (57%), even though Chuuk state population is larger than Pohnpei's population. Chuuk has the second largest student population at the college (20%), which is actually decreasing by 6% over the last five years. The student population from Yap state has remained steady at 12% and the student population from Kosrae hovers around 10%.




Student Population by state of origin fall 2007




Student Population by state of origin fall 2011

The college has historically had slightly more females enrolled than males. The total female student population is just over 50%, while the male student population is around 48%.




Student Population by Gender fall 2007




Student Population by Gender fall 2011


Student Age Distribution fall 2007




Student Age Distribution fall 2011

#### **Load Patterns – FTE vs Part-Time**

The number of full-time students college wide has decreased 6% over the past five years. In 2007, 75% of all students were full-time and in 2011, only 69% of all students were full-time. National campus continues to have the highest percentage of full-time students at around 83%. Chuuk (73%) and Kosrae (45%) campuses have also remained stable for the students registering for twelve or more credits. Yap state campus has increased the number of full-time students by 8% while Pohnpei state campus has declined in the number of full-time students by 24%.






## **Student Achievement**

# **Course Completion**

The course completion rate in 2007 was 77% using ABCD or P. The course completion rate in 2011 is 78% using the same criteria. There has been basically no increase in the percentage of students completing courses at the college.

#### **Retention Rate**

The retention rate for fall 2010 to fall 2011 is 65%, which is an increase from fall 2007 when the retention rate was 52%.



#### **Graduation Rate**

The graduation rates are based on number of students graduating each semester not the three-year graduation rate or 150%. A total of 127 students graduated in Fall 2007 and 170 students graduated in fall 2011. The graphs below show number of graduates per campus for 2007 and 2011.

The 2007 IPEDs Report lists COM-FSM graduation rate at 13% compared to 17% as the median. The 2011 IPEDS report lists the COM-FSM graduation rate at 18%.
